Where does it fit in the curriculum?

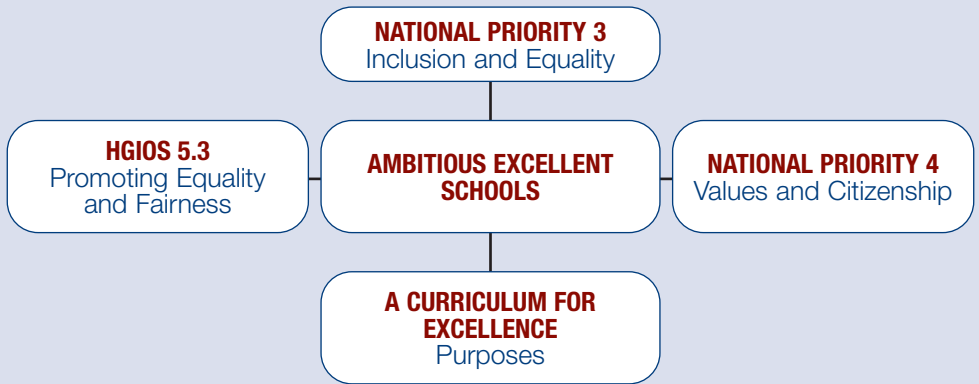
