Regulation (EC) No 1774/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 3 October 2002 laying down health rules concerning animal by-products not intended for human consumption

The Animal By-Products (Scotland) Regulations 2003

Approval of intermediate plants

In accordance with regulation 14 of the Animal By-Products (Scotland) Regulations 2003 and Article 10 of Regulation (EC) No 1774/2002 the Scottish Ministers approve—

- (a) as Category 1 intermediate plants all operators and premises licensed as a collection centre for specified risk material under the TSE (Scotland) Regulations 2002.
- (b) as Category 2 or 3 (as the case may be) intermediate plants any premises on 30 September 2003 collecting that Category of animal by-product for onward transmission for processing, use or disposal under the Animal By-Products Order 1999; and
- (c) as Category 3 intermediate plants all operators and premises currently registered under the Animal By-Products Order 1999 to use premises for the collection of animal by-products for the production of petfood.

It is a condition of approval that premises in paragraph (b) above must apply to the Scottish Executive Environment and Rural Affairs Department for continued approval before 1 January 2004, and failure to do so shall invalidate this approval.

For each premises this approval ceases to apply either when those premises are inspected and an Approval is either granted or refused, or on 1 January 2004, whichever is the earlier.

This approval operates from 1 October 2003.
