FIRST RESULTS FROM NEW HOUSEHOLD SURVEY

PREPARED BY THE GOVERNMENT STATISTICAL SERVICE

Thanks to the first ever Scottish Household Survey, the Scottish Parliament will be better making key decisions affecting people's lives.

The Survey was commissioned by the Government to provide the Scottish Parliament w information about the composition, characteristics and behaviour of Scottish households and local authority level.

The survey focuses on the areas of transport, local government and social inclusion is housing, health and personal finances.

Some key findings from interviews conducted in the first quarter of 1999 include:

· Three-fifths of Scottish households now either own their own homes outright (22 pe their property with the help of a loan or mortgage (39 percent).

Six out of ten households have access to at least one motor vehicle, though this is income - 33 percent of households in the lowest net income group have access to swith 94 percent of those in the highest income group.

- · While 15 percent of adults use recycling facilities at least once a week, 43 percent
- 29 percent of Scottish households have a computer and 12 percent (or roughly access to the Internet from home. Men are more likely than women to have Inter people more likely than older people.

20 percent of adults regularly give up time to help as a volunteer or organiser

How we have changed?

- In 1999
- 22% of Scottish household own their own home outright (in 2017 – 32%)
- Only 15% of adults use recycling facilities once a week
- In 1999 29% of Scottish household had a computer and 12% had access to the internet from home. In 2017 85% of Scottish households reported having internet access at home
- Over half of households (56%) reported they managed well or very well financially in 2017, an increase of 14 percentage points since 1999.




Response rate trends maintaining




Characteristics of households



84% of people in Scotland live in urban areas, while only 16% live in rural areas.

Over six in ten (62%) households are owner occupied. Over one in five (22%) are social rented.




Household type*

More than a third of adults live alone (35%):

- 20% as single adult
- 14% as single older households.

Only 5% are large families consisting of 2 adults and 3 or more children, or 3 or more adults with 1 or more children.




