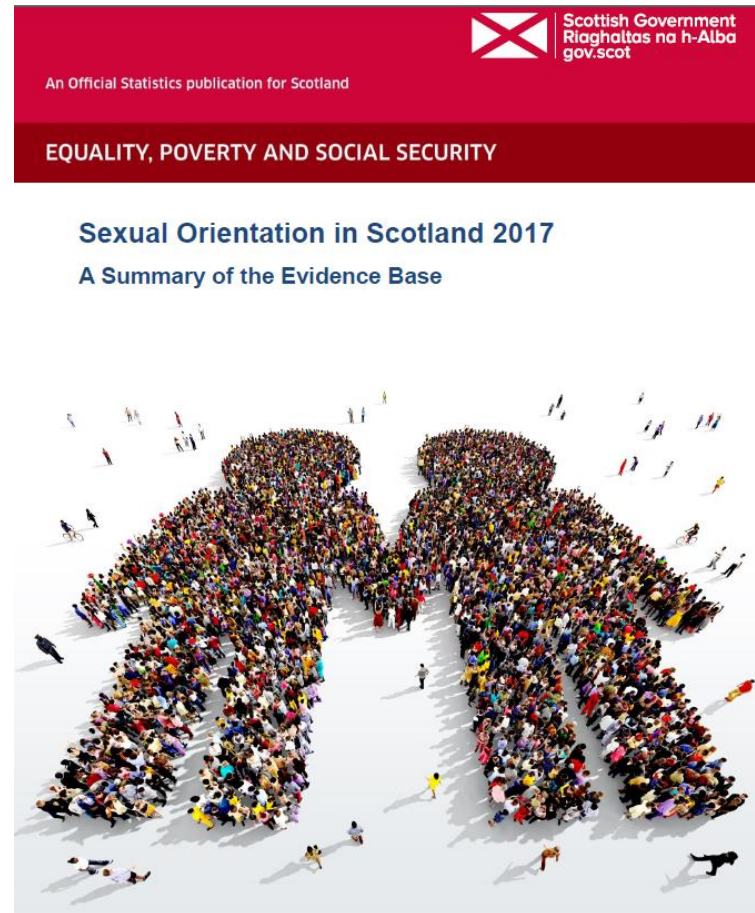

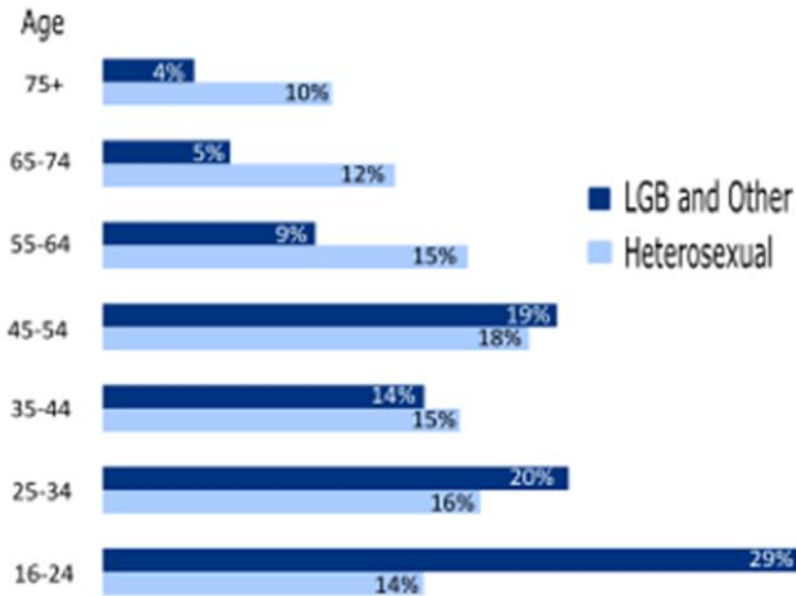

Figure 2: Sexual Orientation by Age – Scotland 2015



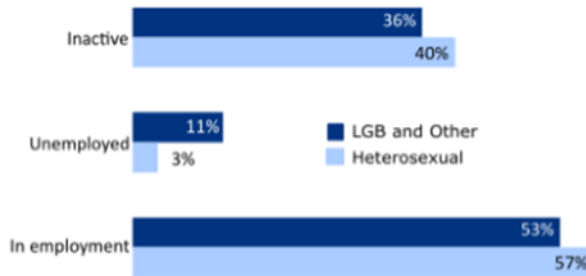
The LGBO group was much **younger** than the heterosexual group.

Figure 11: Sexual Orientation by Economic Activity – Scotland 2015

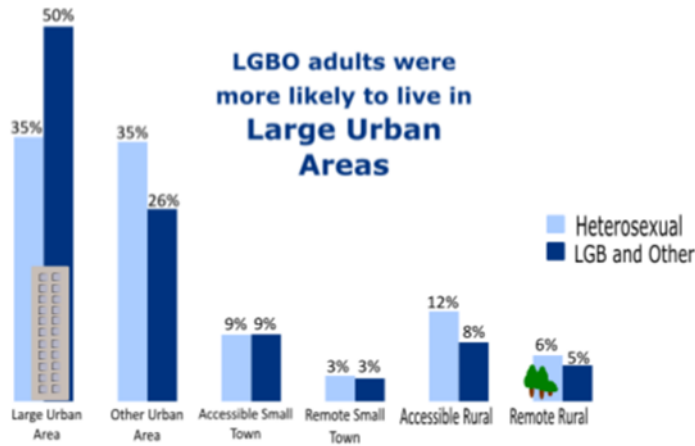
LGBO Adults were over three times more likely to be unemployed



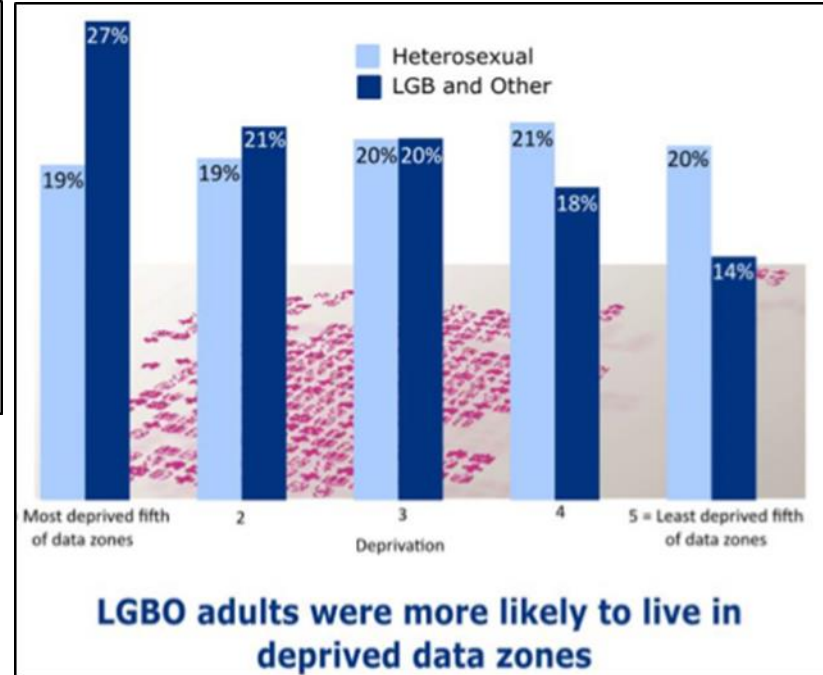

Figure 14: Urban /Rural Areas by Sexual Orientation – Scotland 2015

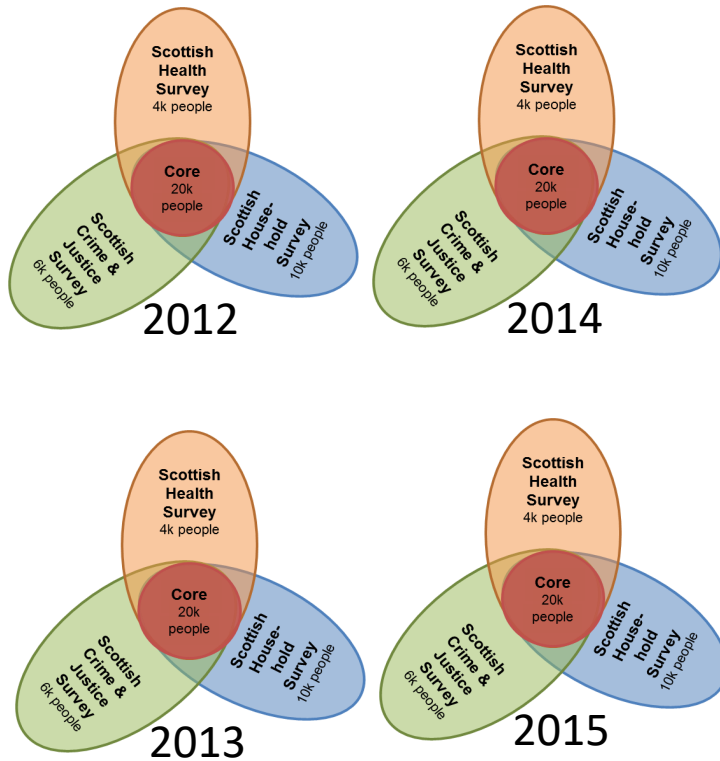
LGBO adults were more likely to live in Large Urban Areas



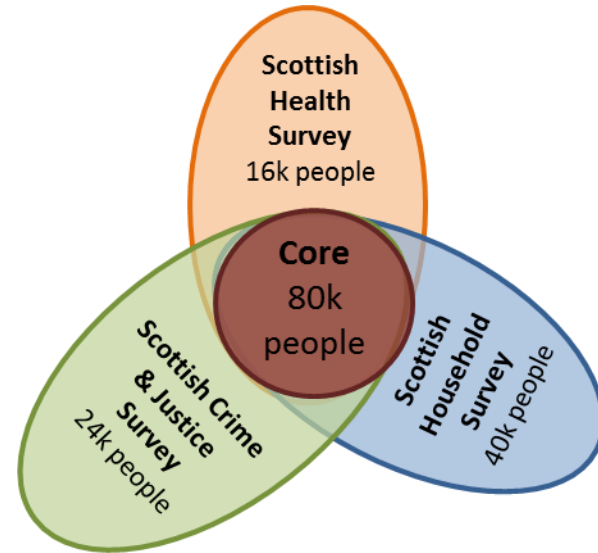

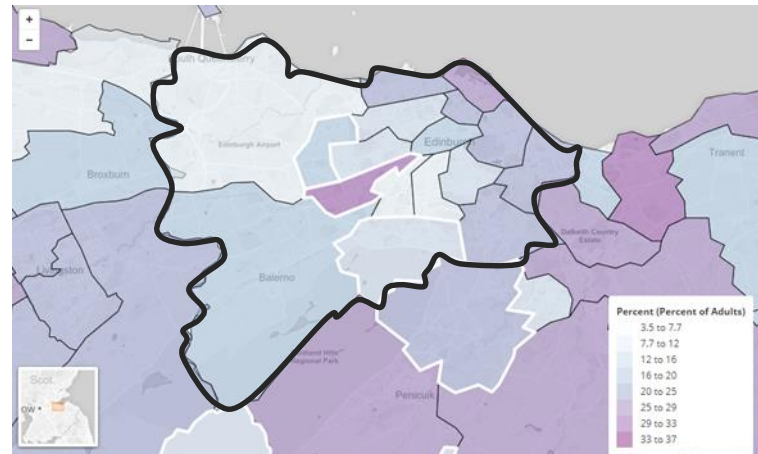

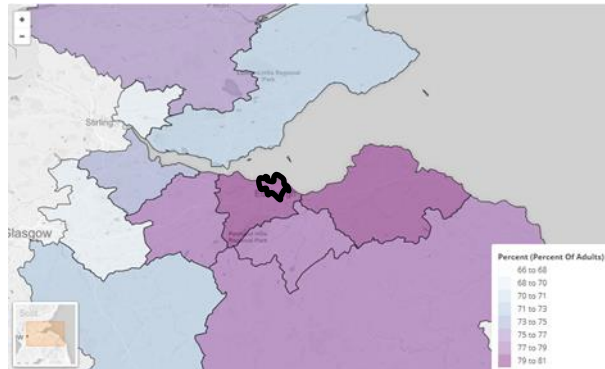


Smoking rates in City of Edinburgh

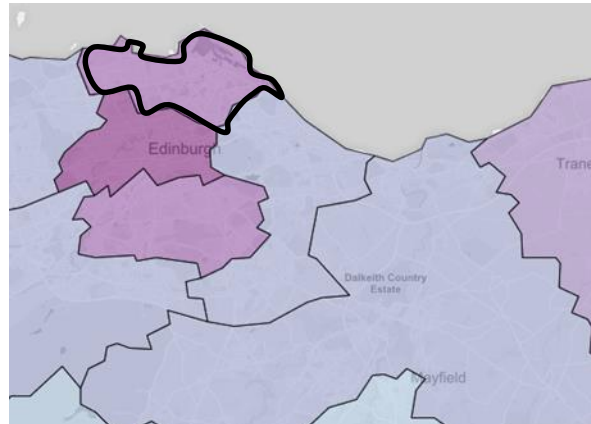

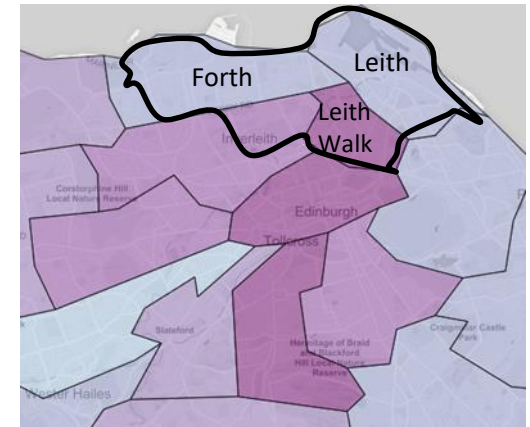

Multiple year datasets provide statistics below Local Authority level: Scottish and UK parliamentary constituencies using two years of combined data and electoral wards using four years of combined data.

Multiyear Statistics on Smoking Prevalence

Multiyear Scottish Survey Core Questions (MySSCQ) pools survey data across multiple years, providing sufficient sample to analyse smoking prevalence at electoral ward, and Scottish- and UK-parliament constituency levels.

(Note that the Scottish Health Survey remains the source of the [National Performance Framework](#) indicator)
